Review of Strategic Plan Working Document:

- Rod then led a discussion to review and explain the draft document. The working document was updated through the course of this discussion.

Trout in the Classroom:

Jim Walker indicated that we are having some difficulty getting parts for the chillers needed in the classrooms. We are missing parts for six chillers. Jim may have found a source for this parts that will allow us to get these six chillers up and running.

Jim reported that there are a total of 40 schools participating in the program this coming year. 11 of these schools are new to the program.

Schools that have participated in the program previously will receive their eggs in December. New schools will receive their eggs in either January or February.
